Highlights from all our CE this year!

We are now licensed to say we Do PINHOLE. We have done variations of this technique for years and the new variations of the technique have made it possible to help more people without having to harvest donor tissue. While still not for everyone, it is a significant improvement for some patients. Please ask us if you have recession or know someone who has receding gums or tooth sensitivity as this may help.

Conversely, if you feel like you show too much gum, ask us about lip lowering. Using this technique with or without the removal of excess gum tissue can often improve the appearance of your smile.

Regarding bone metabolism and healing, it looks like the word is finally

spreading to the medical field about the potential side effects of osteopenia treatment using drugs such as Fosamax, Reclast, and Prolia. If your physician suggests you start one of these medications please call us for our paper on the risks of Bisphosphonates.

Additionally, it appears drugs such as Paxil or other selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRI'S include Celexa, Lexapro, Prozac, Pexeva, Zoloft, and Viibryd) can stimulate osteoclast activity (the cells that remove bone) and inhibit osteoblasts (the cells that form new bone). The net result is that these drugs can decrease bone density and mass at a rate of 0.6 to 0.93% a year and therefore increase your risk of developing osteoporosis.


On the plus side it looks like Statins may increase bone mass and density by decreasing osteoclast differentiation. These drugs may also help prevent Alzheimer's development.

Lastly a word about smoking. Smoking 1.5 packs a day more than doubles the failure rate of dental implants. It also appears that the longer you have smoked the higher the failure rate, so the damage from smoking is cumulative. Second hand smoke also increases failure rate of implants by about 60% over patients not exposed to second hand smoke.

If you smoke and you would like help in trying to quit please let us know. There are now some excellent prescription aids to help people quit smoking. It appears that e-cigarettes or vaping does not help people quit. It just creates another addiction and may not be significantly better for you than cigarettes.
